CPCS's Peace and Conflict Studies library was opened on May 21st 2006 by well-known peace mediator, Dr. Johan Galtung. It was originally supported by the German Development Service (DED). Holding over 1,100 titles specific to peace and conflict issues from around the world, it aims to be the largest resource of its kind in Cambodia.

Aim:

To deepen the knowledge and understanding of peace practitioners and social activists in the Asia Pacific region.

Objectives:

- To collect a wide range of books and materials related to peace and conflict
- To provide an accessible service for students of Peace courses
- To create a space for discussion and dialogue on peace and conflict
- To encourage practitioners to reflect on their practice and compare their existing theories and work to that documented from other places.

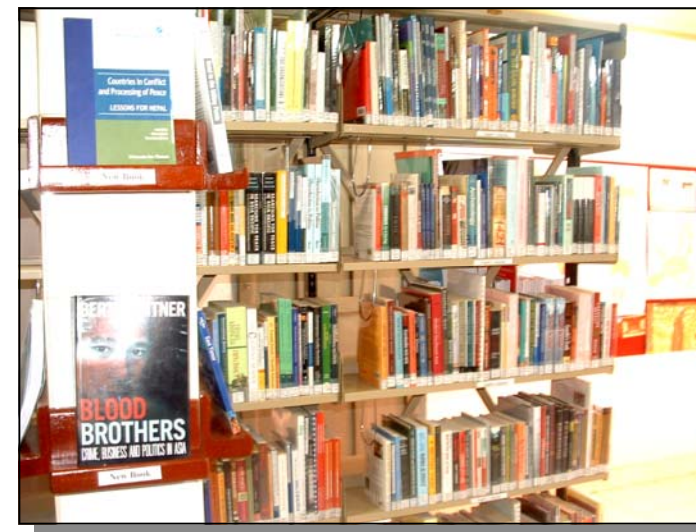
